Additional programs in June include a documentary screening of *Stateless* in partnership with PAMM's Caribbean Cultural Institute and Third Horizon Film Festival, the opening of **Marco Brambilla: Heaven's Gate**, and Live Virtual Local Views.

#### **Pride Month Tours**

**June–September 2021, Thursdays at 6pm and Saturdays at 3pm**

Visit the galleries and join a public guided tour highlighting works across various exhibitions by LGBTQIA+ identifying artists or that focus on the LGBTQIA+ community. The selection features artworks by **Igshaan Adams, Hernán Bas, Carlos Alfonzo, Andrea Geyer, John Giorno, Elliott Hundley, Jasper Johns, Zanele Muholi, Christina Quarles, Zilia Sánchez, Mickalene Thomas, and Kehinde Wiley**, among others. Tours are currently limited to fifteen guests per tour and are offered on a first-come, first-served basis. Tours are free with museum admission.

#### **Juneteenth Weekend Kickoff with Afropunk**

**Thursday, June 17, 7pm–12am**

Guests are invited to kick off Juneteenth weekend early at PAMM! Enjoy an outdoor evening of live music, art, community, and a screening of **AFROPUNK BLACK SPRING** which features Miami's own **ArtLoveTrap, Willie Clarke, DJ Kumi, Masisi, Jenny Perez, and Seafoam Walls**. **DJ LaNegra Fabulosa** and **DJ Kumi** will spin live on the waterfront terrace before the screening of *BLACK SPRING*.

#### **Marco Brambilla: Heaven's Gate Opening**

**Thursday, June 17, 2–9pm**

A satirical, vertigo-inducing meditation on the Hollywood 'Dream Factory,' Marco Brambilla's *Heaven's Gate* takes viewers through a time capsule of lush cinematic landscapes of collaged film samples collected from famous Hollywood images, featuring major stars like Leonardo DiCaprio, Christopher Walken, Beyoncé, Audrey Hepburn, and Matthew McConaughey. To enhance the experience, guests will be able to watch the spectacular video work with special VR headsets.

#### **Pride Month on Film**

**Thursday, June 24, 2–9pm**

To celebrate National Pride Month, a selection of films curated by Miami-based artist **Thom Wheeler Castillo** will be screened on loop in the PAMM Auditorium. The film selection will focus on themes such as manifesto, history, joyful camp, loss, quotidian moment, and love. Socially distanced seating will be available on a first-come, first-served basis.

**PAMM CCI Presents Third Horizon Film Festival 2021: Stateless**

**Saturday, June 26, 3–5:30pm**

[Third Horizon Film Festival 2021](#), in partnership with Pérez Art Museum Miami's [Caribbean Cultural Institute \(CCI\)](#), presents a screening of the acclaimed new documentary **Stateless**. The film traces the complex tributaries of history and present-day politics in the Dominican Republic, as state-sanctioned racism seeps into mundane offices, living room meetings, and street protests. The screening will be followed by an extended discussion with filmmaker **Michèle Stephenson** and the film's protagonist **Rosa Iris Diendomi**, as well as **France Francois**, founder and CEO of InCultured Company, an organization that works on conflict resolution and reconciliation between Haitians and Dominicans. The discussion will be moderated by filmmaker and Third Horizon member **Monica Sorelle**.
