

Pérez Art Museum Miami and SCOPE Miami Beach Announce Inaugural Acquisition Gift Selection

Artwork by Deborah Jack From Pen + Brush Selected for PAMM's Permanent Collection

(MIAMI, FL — December 12, 2023) — **Pérez Art Museum Miami (PAMM)** and **SCOPE Miami Beach** are pleased to announce the selection of the first annual **SCOPE Acquisition Gift for PAMM**, an acquisition gift for the museum's permanent collection selected from the 22nd edition of SCOPE Miami Beach, which takes place December 5–10, 2023. **PAMM Chief Curator Gilbert Vicario** has selected Deborah Jack's **fecund memories of sky and salt... the amnesia of a history unrehearsed, still lush...** from Pen + Brush Gallery.

The inaugural SCOPE Acquisition Gift for PAMM was created to augment the relationship between the museum and the fair's dynamic roster of experimental galleries and emerging artists while allowing the opportunity to support and engage with the cultural institutions of Miami-Dade County. The SCOPE Acquisition Gift for PAMM is funded by Alexis Hubshman, founder of SCOPE and cochair of the SCOPE Circle.

"We are thrilled to acquire a work from SCOPE and we look forward to having Deborah Jack's work in PAMM's collection! We have huge admiration for her practice and for the evocative eye she brings to timely themes of labor, collective histories, and ecology. Pen + Bush's belief that art is central to the human experience and their dedication to uplifting work created by women is in deep alignment with PAMM's mission of centering diverse voices, and we are thrilled to foster our relationship with SCOPE through this acquisition," said **PAMM Chief Curator Gilbert Vicario.**

Deborah Jack, is a St. Maarten and Jersey City based multidisciplinary artist who works across mediums of video, sound, installation, photography, painting and text to explore the intersections of histories, cultural memory, ecology and climate change. The selected artwork incorporates both video and still images and juxtaposes Dutch archival videos of colonial footage of labor in a salt pond with the lush flora of the land. This is in keeping with Jack's practice of looking at the history of extraction capitalism, as experienced in smaller landscapes.

"As the executive director of Pen + Brush and someone who is deeply committed to our mission of creating opportunity, equity, and legacy for women artists, I am profoundly honored by PAMM's acquisition of Deborah Jack's work from our booth at SCOPE. This is the first time our 129-year-old gallery has shown at an art fair, so this acquisition from an institution that is so aligned with our mission and a thought leader in the field is a testament to the fact that with support and access to the field, significant work *can* get through," said **Dawn Delikat, executive director of Pen + Brush**

Pen + Brush is a 129-year-old publicly supported not-for-profit fighting for gender equity in the arts. P+B encourages and mentors emerging professionals and aims to expose the stereotypes and misconceptions that perpetuate gender-based exclusion, lack of recognition and the devaluation of skill that is still experienced by women in the arts.

Pérez Art Museum Miami (PAMM), led by Director Franklin Sirmans, promotes artistic expression and the exchange of ideas, advancing public knowledge and appreciation of art, architecture, and design, and reflecting the diverse community of its pivotal geographic location at the crossroads of the Americas.
