Event Raised More Than \$130,000 to Support Advancing Women's Representation in the Arts

(MIAMI, FL — October 17, 2025) — On Wednesday, October 15, **Pérez Art Museum Miami (PAMM)** hosted its annual **International Women's Committee (IWC) Luncheon** with premier sponsorship from The Related Group and supporting sponsorship from Carnival Corporation and Greene Street. The celebration honored **Alexa Isbell Wolman**, a PAMM trustee, executive, lawyer, philanthropist, and arts leader, for her transformative contributions to Miami's cultural community.
